Debate on the Social Impact of AI: An acceptable AI for, with and by the citizens: A horizon of potential actions from DT4Regions

Al-based technologies have generated **enormous attention and sharp ethical debates**, as they have created tensions in the existing regulatory frameworks and prompted many questions in essential dimensions of our life: our identity as individuals, our right to privacy, the roles we can play in a dynamic labour market. Particularly, this has been associated with the unleashed capacity of automation of processes, the increased machine-based decision-making with a focus on potential bias and control over these decisions, and the possibility of monitoring, profiling, processing and creating massive data in real time on the Internet. What an acceptable Al is, and how to engage our citizens in the co-design and validation of approaches, are open areas of work. This debate will tackle the essential issue of how to deploy an acceptable Al in our cities, communities and regions, and it will address this topic from the perspective of how to do it by applying a citizen-centric approach.

Workshop 1

The integration of AI into Digital Twins: The City as a physical and digital living lab

Recently, Digital Twins have attracted more and more interest from managers, policy makers and representatives of European Cities and Regions. Since Digital Twins allow for the simulation of complex processes in dynamic environments, they are **excellent candidates for the modelling of real cities**. Specific objects, processes and/or services in the Physical City are replicated in its Digital Version (the Digital Twin). This opens the door to the validation of processes in areas such as urban design, mobility, energy, waste management, industrial processes and so on, in real time, while having control on the different variables and the potential scenarios of use. The integration of Al into the Digital Twin advances the **optimization of decision-making processes**, opening up a world of opportunities. This session will introduce the basics of Digital Twin technologies, propose clear directions for the integration of Al into the Digital Twin, and illustrate fully-curated examples already working in the European context, with the support of bibliographic material and a repository of case-studies.

Data Governance and Data Spaces for Al Solutions

To design and carry out new and enhanced public services to the benefit of their citizens and stakeholders, **regional and local administrations need access to increased sets of data**. While some forerunners are paving the way with their ventures, at EU level the rollout of common European data spaces is to be promoted with ongoing and forthcoming actions, with special reference to a data space for smart communities and a dedicated interoperability framework. This workshop explores the **linkage between such initiatives and the development of DT4REGIONS**, inquiring into potential contributions by the project. It also sheds light on the current state of the art of regional and local use cases of applications based on AI and BD in the public sector, by drawing from the most recent landscape analyses.
